Whereas he served on the site selection team for the Raymond M. Blasco, M. D., Library and on the fundraising team that raised \$2.1 million to furnish the library;

Whereas he was recognized by the Pennsylvania Citizens for Better Libraries with the Lifetime Achievement Award for his exceptional meritorious service to libraries over an extended time and throughout the state;

Whereas he has served the Governor's Advisory Council as a lay member, chairing the Bylaws Committee and serving on the Legislative Committee and others during his long tenure;
